1. Using the white yarn, cast on 10 stitches.
2. Knit every row for 15 rows.
3. Shape the nose by decreasing 1 stitch at each end of every other row until 2 stitches remain.
4. Cast off the remaining stitches.

Beard of Santa (Knit Flat):

1. Using the white yarn, cast on 20 stitches.
2. Knit every row for 20 rows.
3. Cast off all stitches.

Assembling the Tea Cosy

1. Sew the body of the tea cosy to the flap along the short edges.
2. Sew the hood to the back of the tea cosy, aligning the centre of the hood with the centre of the back.
3. Sew the nose to the front of the tea cosy, just below the hood.
4. Sew the beard to the front of the tea cosy, below the nose.
5. Embroider the eyes and mouth of Santa using black embroidery thread.
6. Stuff Santa's belly with a small amount of stuffing material.

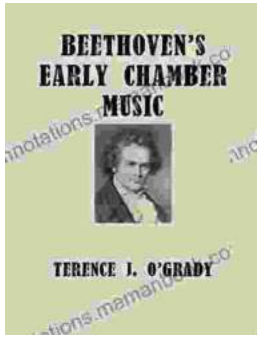
