

 Ideas and Content: The ideas and content of a piece of writing are the heart of the writing. Students need to be able to generate ideas,

- organize their thoughts, and develop their ideas into a coherent and cohesive piece of writing.
- Organization: The organization of a piece of writing refers to the way that the ideas are arranged and presented. - Sentence Fluency: The sentence fluency of a piece of writing refers to the way that the sentences flow together. Students need to be able to write sentences that are clear, concise, and varied in length and structure.
- **Conventions:** The conventions of writing refer to the grammar, usage, and mechanics of writing. Students need to be able to use the conventions of writing correctly in order to produce a piece of writing that is error-free and easy to understand.



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
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
